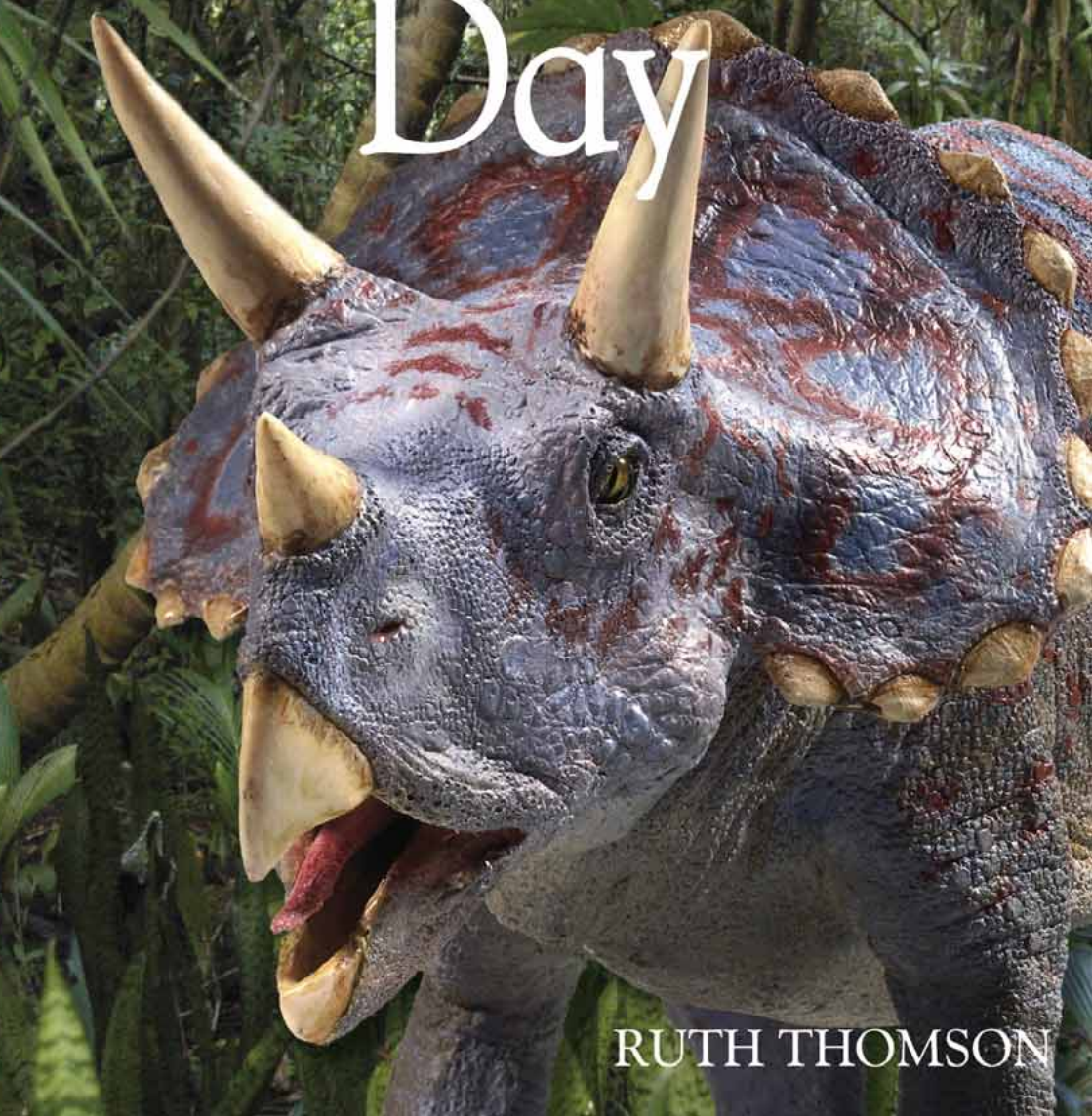

A Note to Parents

The “normal” age at which a child begins to read can be anywhere from three to eight years old. Adult participation through the lower levels is very helpful for providing encouragement, discussing storylines, and sounding out unfamiliar words.

They might want to eat us!

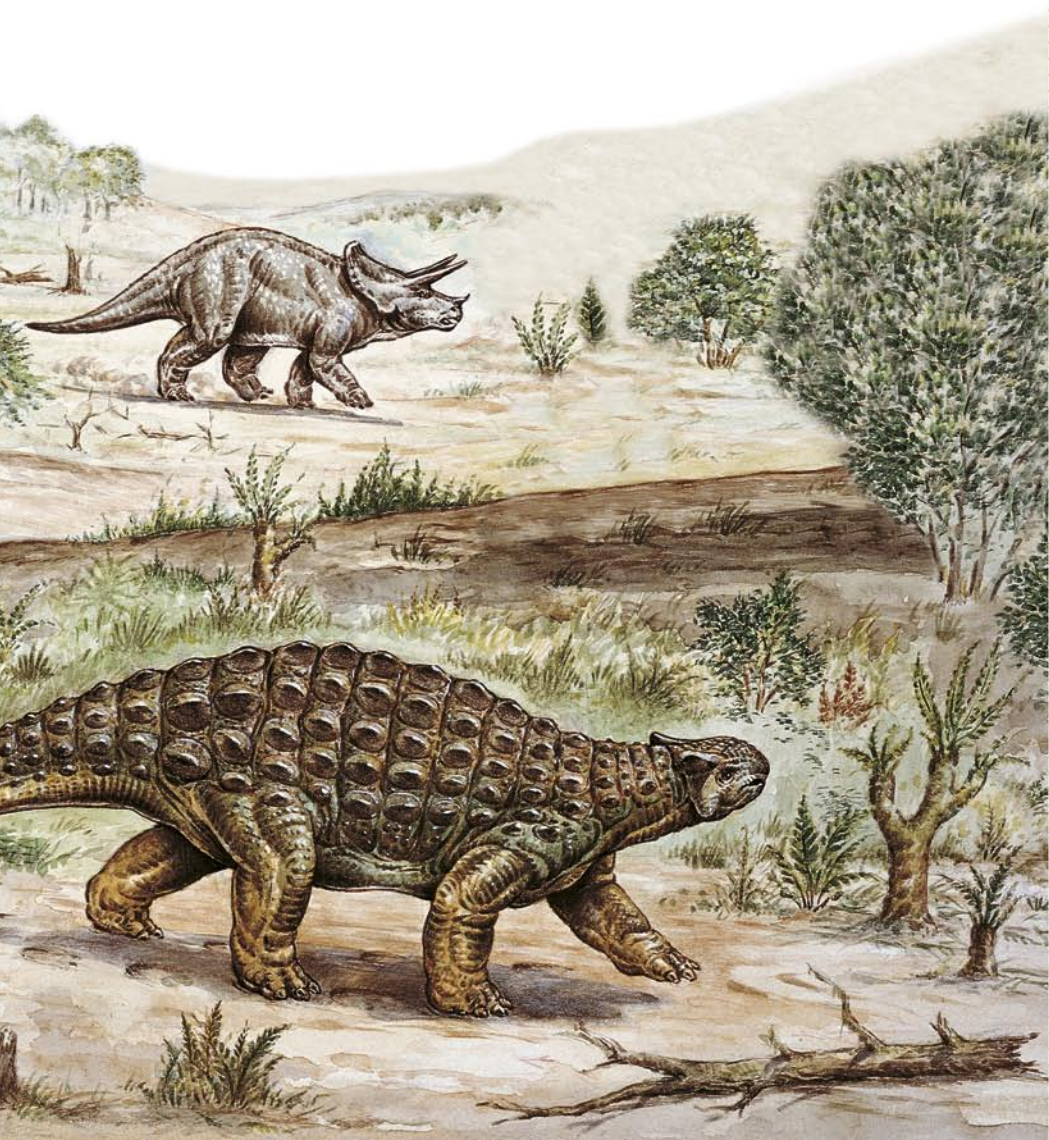


All sorts of other dinosaurs

Everything is peaceful.

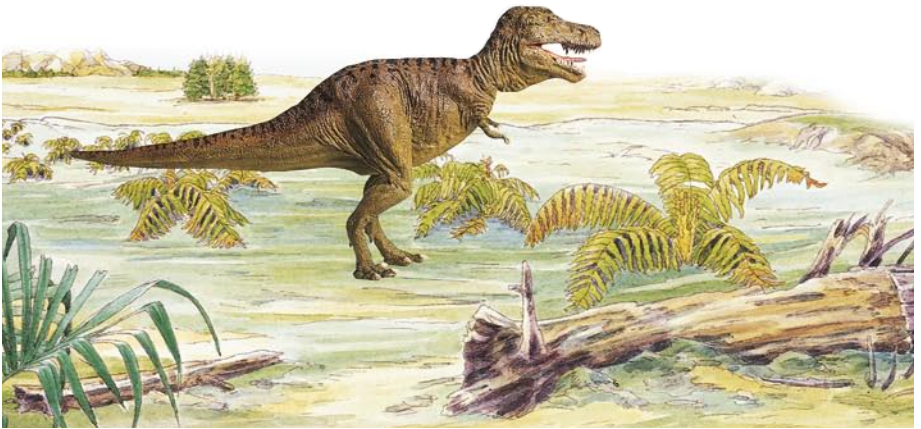
All of a sudden,

and sharp claws.

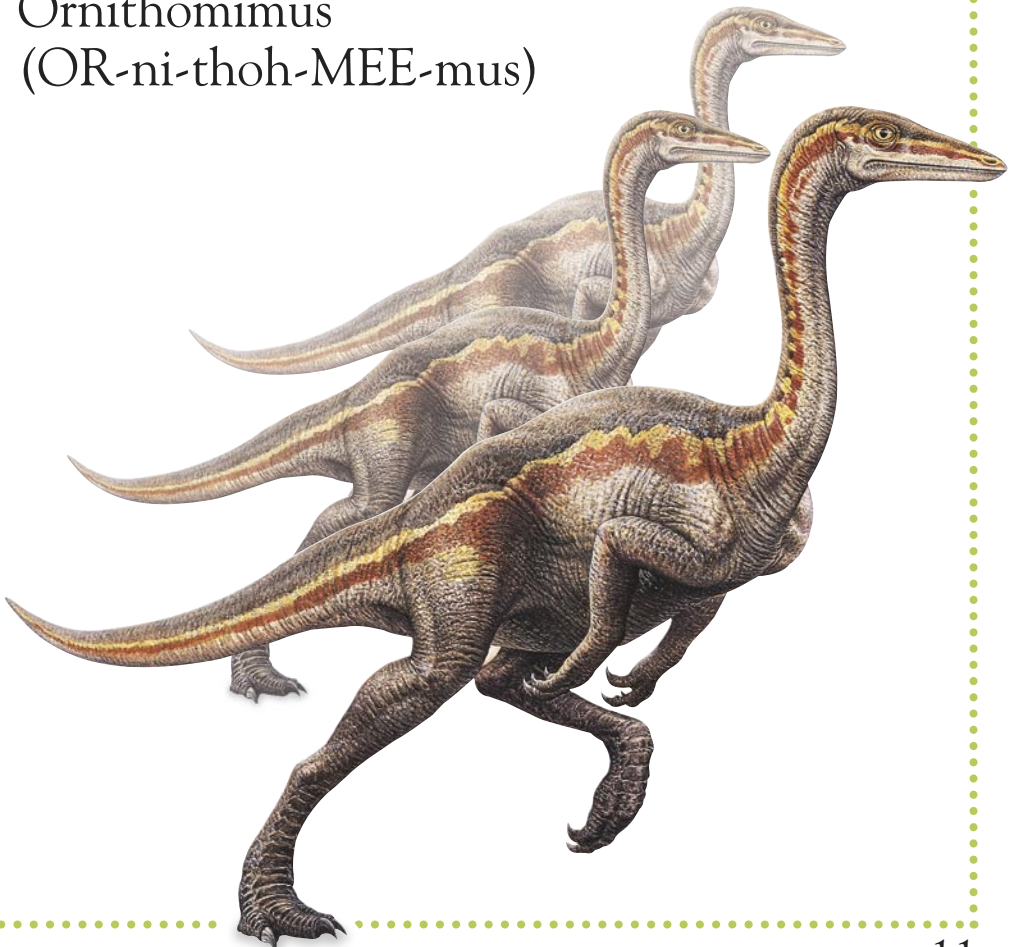
He has a huge mouth

(OR-ni-thoh-MEE-mus)

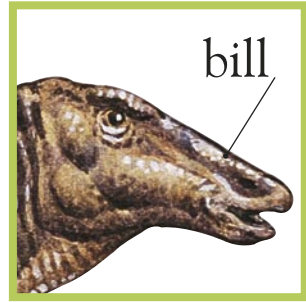


The duck-billed dinosaurs
stop eating.

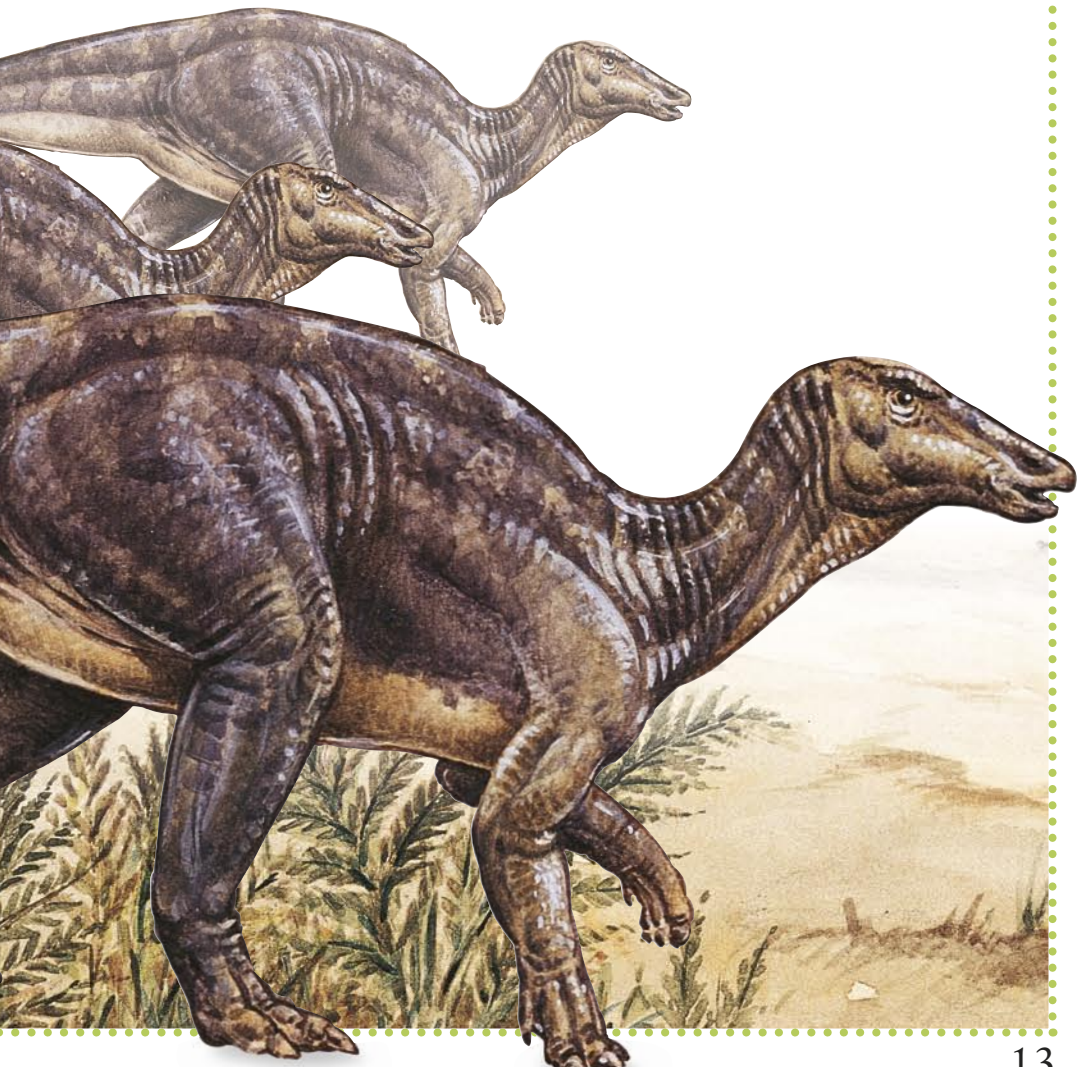
They watch Tyrannosaurus.

he will run away too.

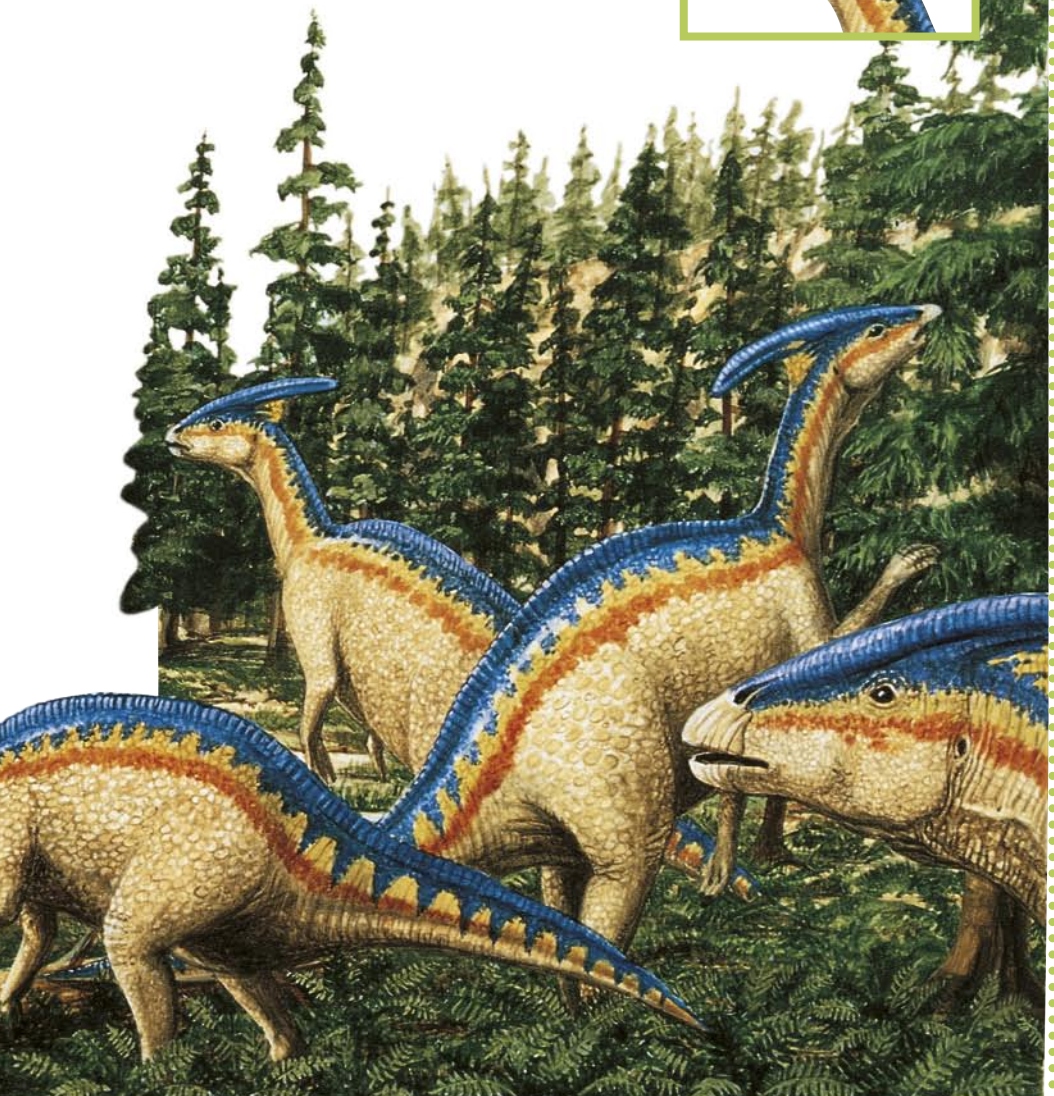


Pachycephalosaurus

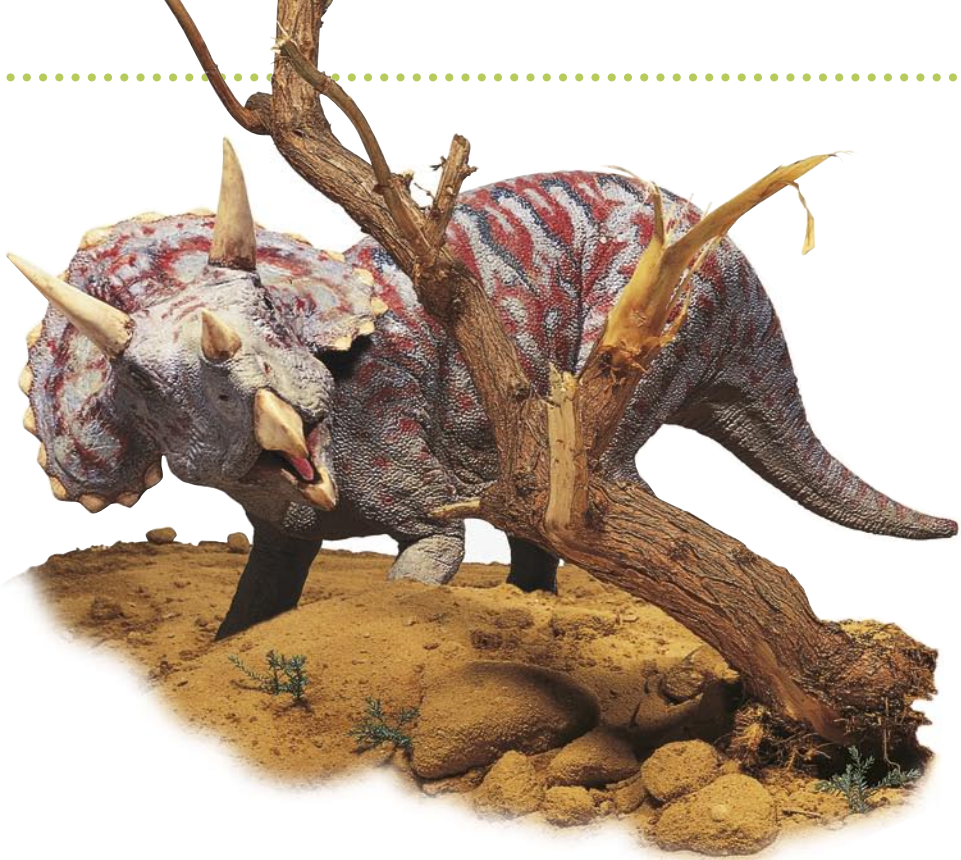


Ankylosaurus
(an-KIE-luh-SORE-us)



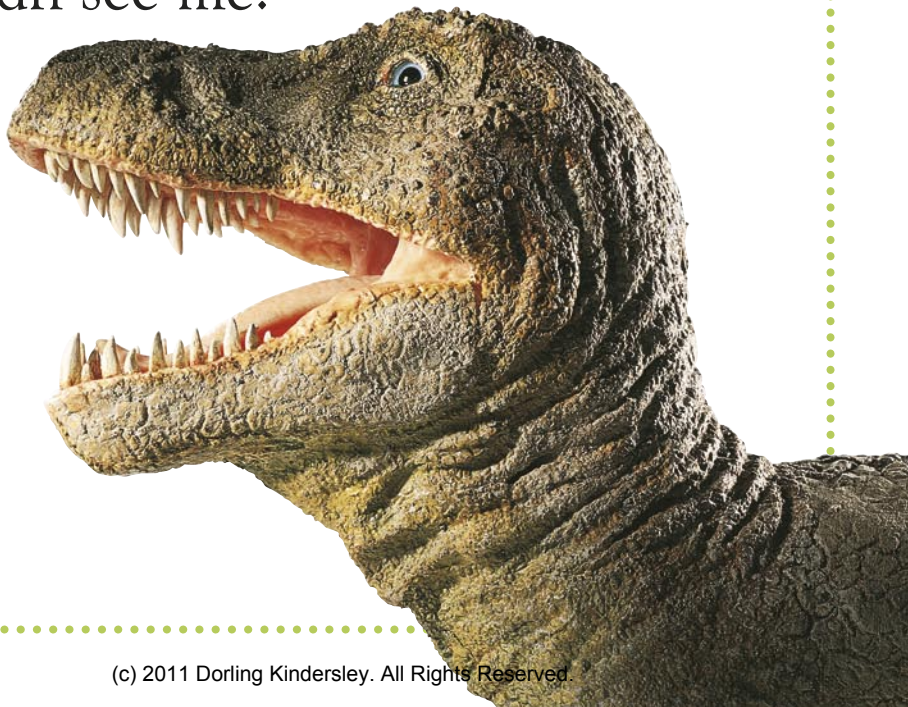
I am busy watching

I forget to stay with my herd.



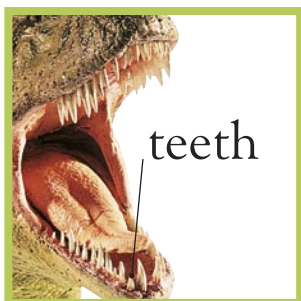


I can see Tyrannosaurus.

I can see his sharp teeth.

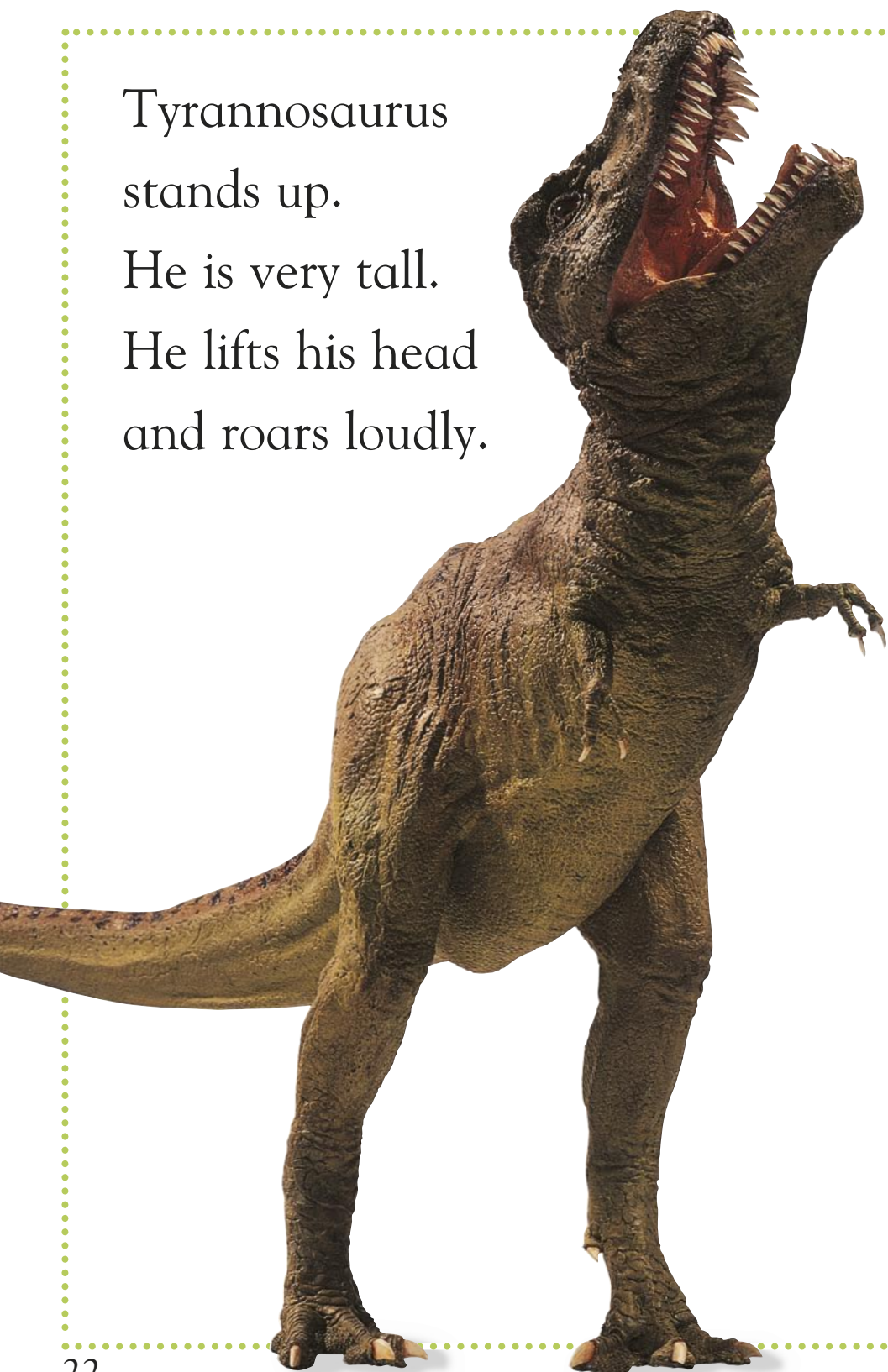
Thud!

and roars loudly.

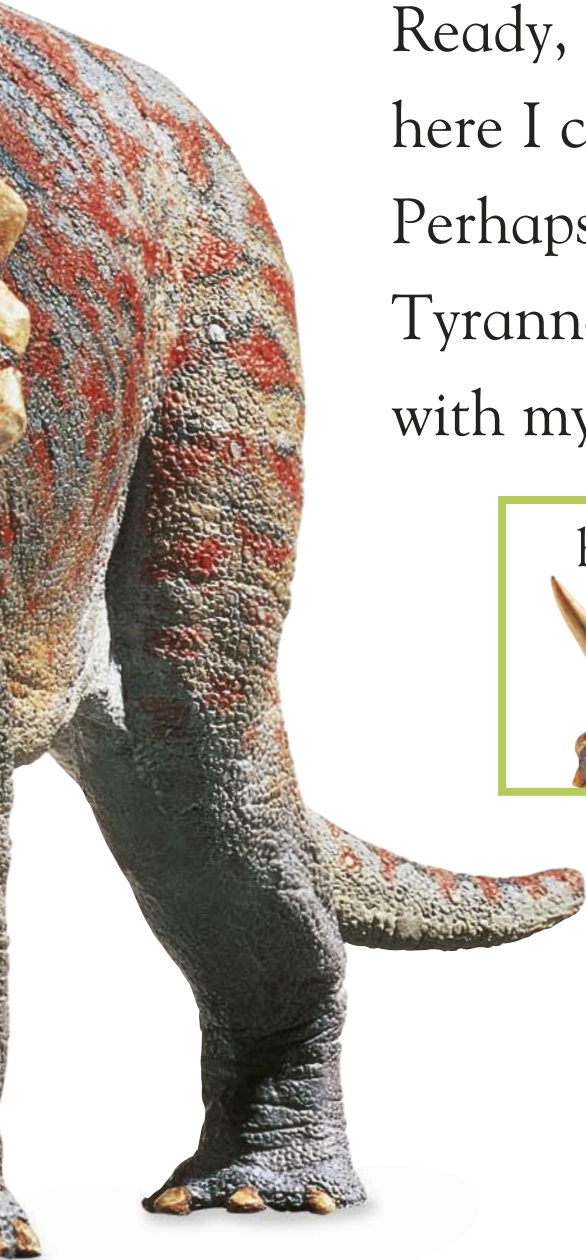
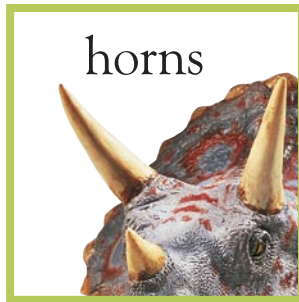


Tyrannosaurus is trying

with my sharp horns.



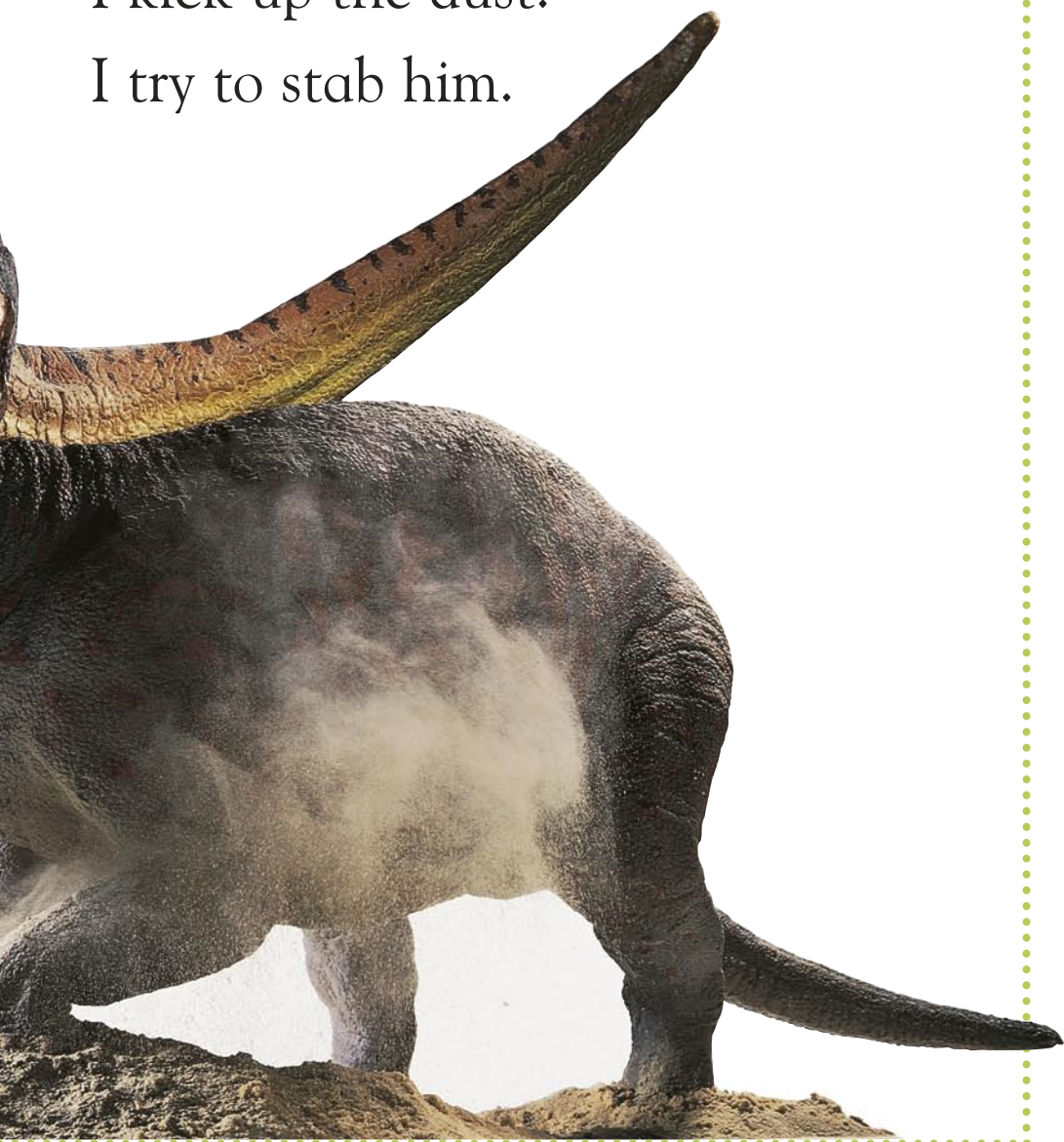


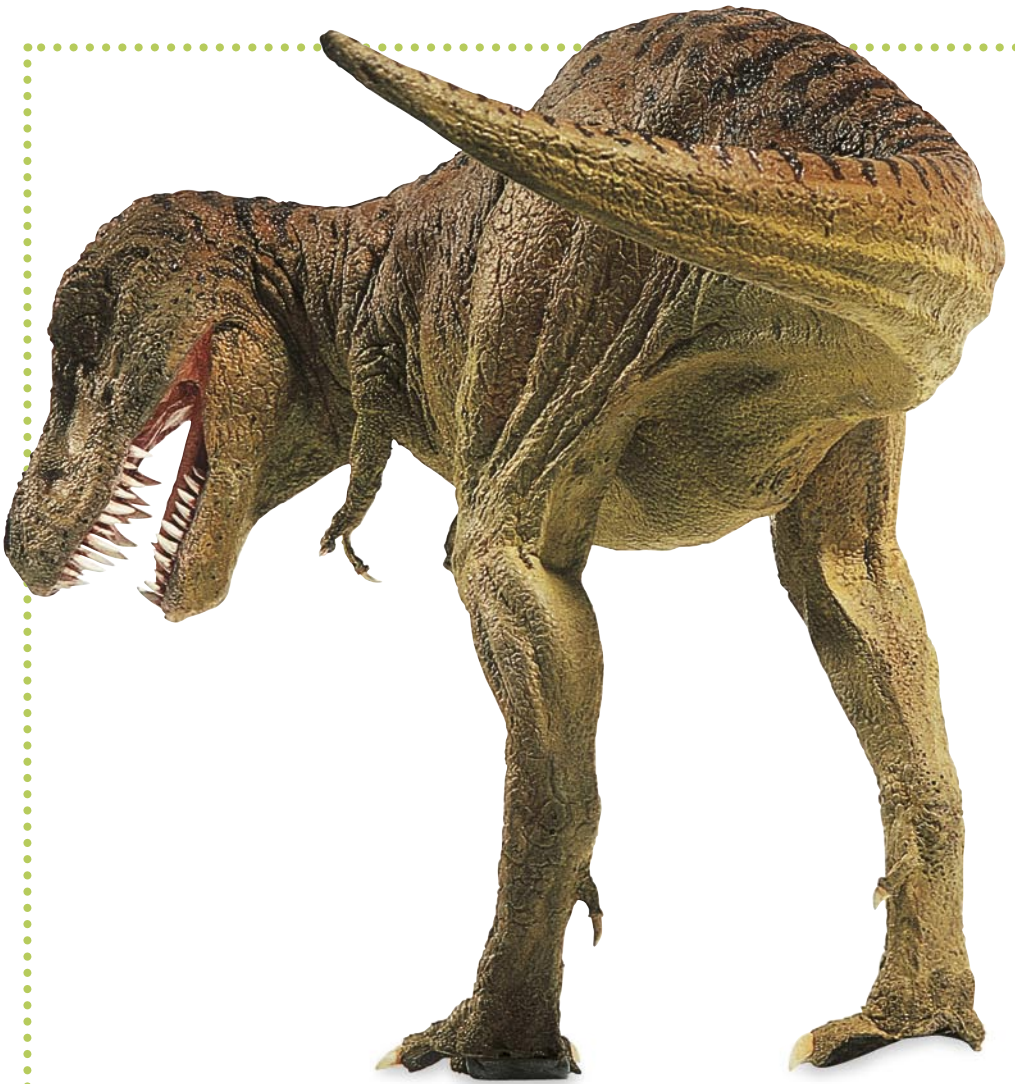
Tyrannosaurus tries to bite me

I try to stab him.



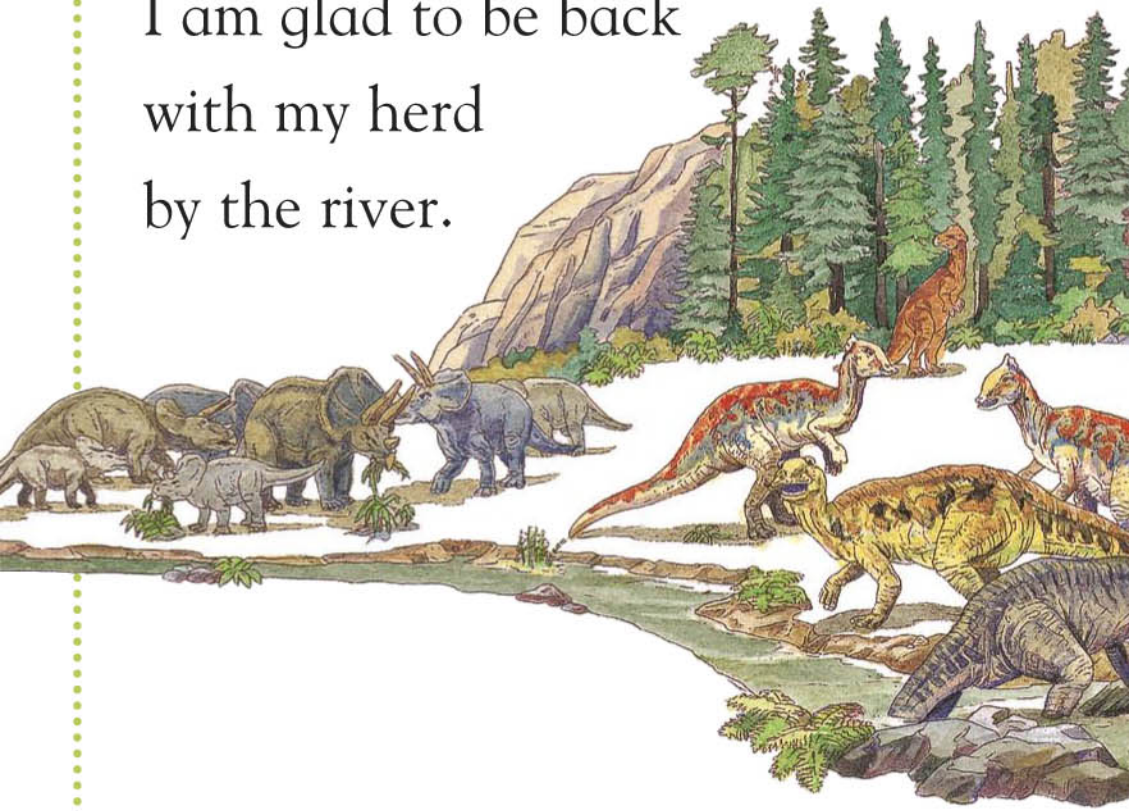


Tyrannosaurus is getting tired.

after all that fighting.

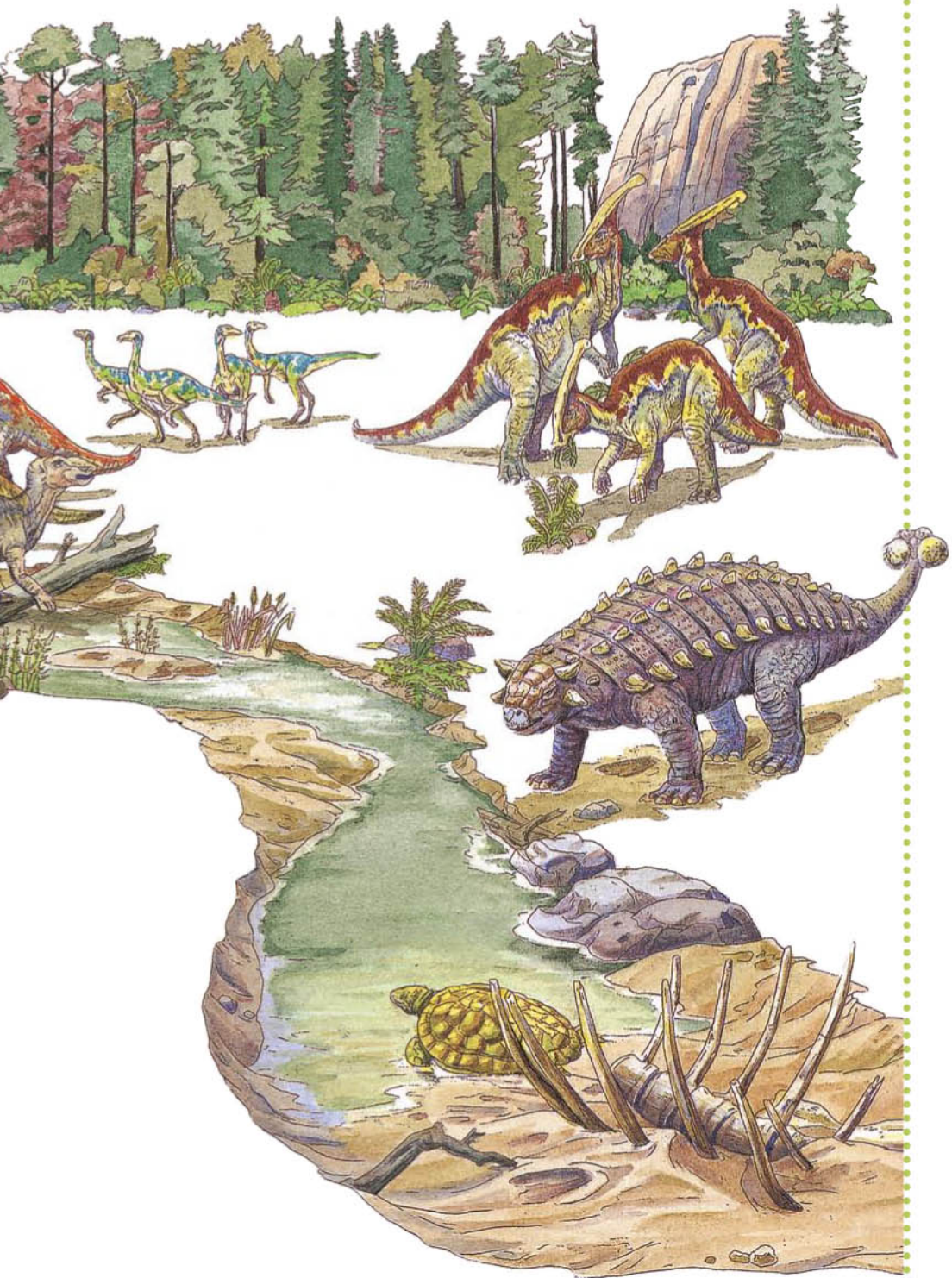


I am glad to be back
