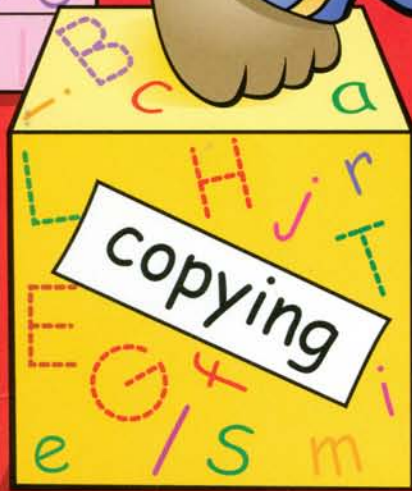

Have fun!



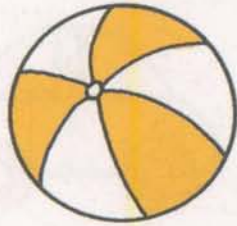
